The total budget for this fiscal year ending in 6/30/12 is \$26,000. All insurance premiums paid to date amount to \$23,766.80 less refund from Workers Compensation of \$925 leaving a balance of \$3,158.20 under budget. We anticipate a refund of \$1,595 prior to month's end closing out our insurance account under budget by \$4,753.20.
