Three concerns were closed. A letter was sent regarding a wooden structure.

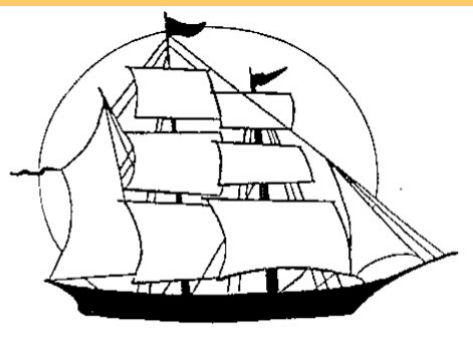
Tree Removal Requests
