Beautification

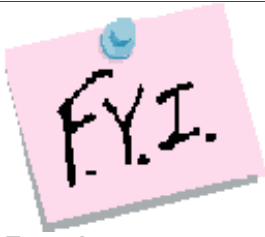

Security

There were 2 incidents at the Gate in the past week. One is going to cost a resident in the area of \$650.00. They tried to have a truck tailgate them into the Village and the gate came down on the truck. There are several safe ways to get someone through the gate. The easiest is to use your proximity Card. Have the person pull up to the gate and then use your card to let them in. Another way if you are working on a project that requires contractors to enter several times is get a code from the office. **Do not have people tailgate. This is dangerous and costly.**

Our License plate camera caught the 2nd incident as the person tried to force the gate up and drive under it. This caused about \$300.00 in damage to the gate and most likely that much to the car.
